Why it matters: A successful entrepreneur needs a dedicated and skilled team to execute the business plan and drive growth.

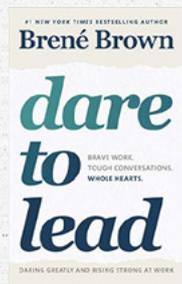
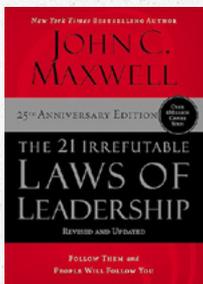
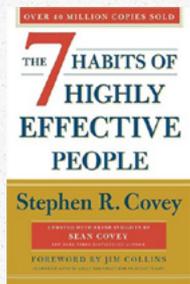




How to develop strong leadership skills
